
DURING JANUARY TO MARCH 2024:

- 2024 MARKS THE BUSIEST FIRST QUARTER SINCE THE MERSEY GATEWAY OPENED over 6.22 million journeys were made over the River Mersey in Halton
- 12 OUT OF THE LAST 13 MONTHS HAVE SEEN TRAFFIC LEVELS EXCEED TWO MILLION VEHICLES **EACH MONTH** – only April 2023's figure was under the two million mark
- OVER 92% OF CUSTOMERS USED DIGITAL PAYMENTS METHODS over 142,000 payments were made using the merseyflow Quick-Pay App in March 2024, the highest monthly figure recorded since the app launched
- PCN's REMAIN CONSISTENT AS A % OF OVERALL JOURNEYS over 97.5% of journeys were paid for on time

All revenue, either from tolls/charges or PCNs, contributes towards payment for the Mersey Gateway Bridge. It is not retained by the council or any of its contractors.



Total journeys and number of PCNs issued




PCNs drop in line with seasonal trend

PCNs issued




Bridge usage from January – March 2024
