

#### **Total Journeys and Penalty Charge Notices (PCNs)**





## **DURING APRIL TO JUNE 2018:**

- nearly 6 million journeys were made across the new bridge.
- 96% of drivers paid for their crossings before the payment deadline.
- 77% of journeys were made in vehicles registered with merseyflow.
- over 73,000 journeys were made across the bridge most weekdays, which is in excess
  of projected traffic levels.
- **between 19 and 23% of monthly revenue came from PCNs.** All revenue, either from tolls or PCNs, contributes towards payment for the new bridge; it is not retained by the Council or any of its contractors.
