
DURING OCTOBER TO DECEMBER 2021:

- SILVER JUBILEE BRIDGE TRAFFIC INCREASED WHILST MERSEY GATEWAY TRAFFIC DIPPED
 SLIGHTLY SJB traffic was consistent throughout the Christmas period whereas less commuters used
 Mersey Gateway in December due to a mix of holidays and Covid-19
- OVER 97% OF JOURNEYS WERE PAID FOR ON TIME the vast majority of people are paying for their journeys by midnight the day after they cross
- OVER 90% OF PAYMENTS ARE MADE THROUGH DIGITAL OR AUTOMATED CHANNELS the merseyflow website, quick pay app and auto top-up options are widely used by customers
- PCNs REMAIN BELOW HISTORICAL LEVELS FROM 2018/2019 and have decreased by a greater proportion than the quarterly drop in journey numbers

All revenue, either from tolls/charges or PCNs, contributes towards payment for the Mersey Gateway Bridge. It is not retained by the council or any of its contractors.

Total journeys and number of PCNs issued




PCNs decrease as a % of journey numbers

PCNs issued




Bridge usage from October - December 2021
