
#### **DURING JANUARY TO MARCH 2021:**

- 11.6% OF TOTAL JOURNEYS ACROSS THE RIVER MERSEY IN MARCH WERE MADE ACROSS
   THE SILVER JUBILEE BRIDGE this averages out as 5,900 journeys a day
- OVER 60% OF JOURNEYS ACROSS THE SILVER JUBILEE BRIDGE IN MARCH WERE
   MADE BY REGISTERED HALTON RESIDENTS whereas Halton residents made up just over a third of the journeys made across the Mersey Gateway Bridge
- PCNs CONTINUE TO FALL AS A PERCENTAGE OF JOURNEY NUMBERS journeys made dropped by 28% compared to this time last year, whereas PCNs have dropped by 41%
- 26% OF ONE-OFF JOURNEYS PAID FOR THROUGH MERSEYFLOW QUICK PAY APP app payments rose above a quarter for the first time ever


All revenue, either from tolls/charges or PCNs, contributes towards payment for the Mersey Gateway Bridge. It is not retained by the council or any of its contractors.

### Quarterly journey numbers down – by almost 10%


#### Total journeys and number of PCNs issued



### PCNs decrease by 41%\* – a drop of 61,000




#### Bridge usage in March 2021


